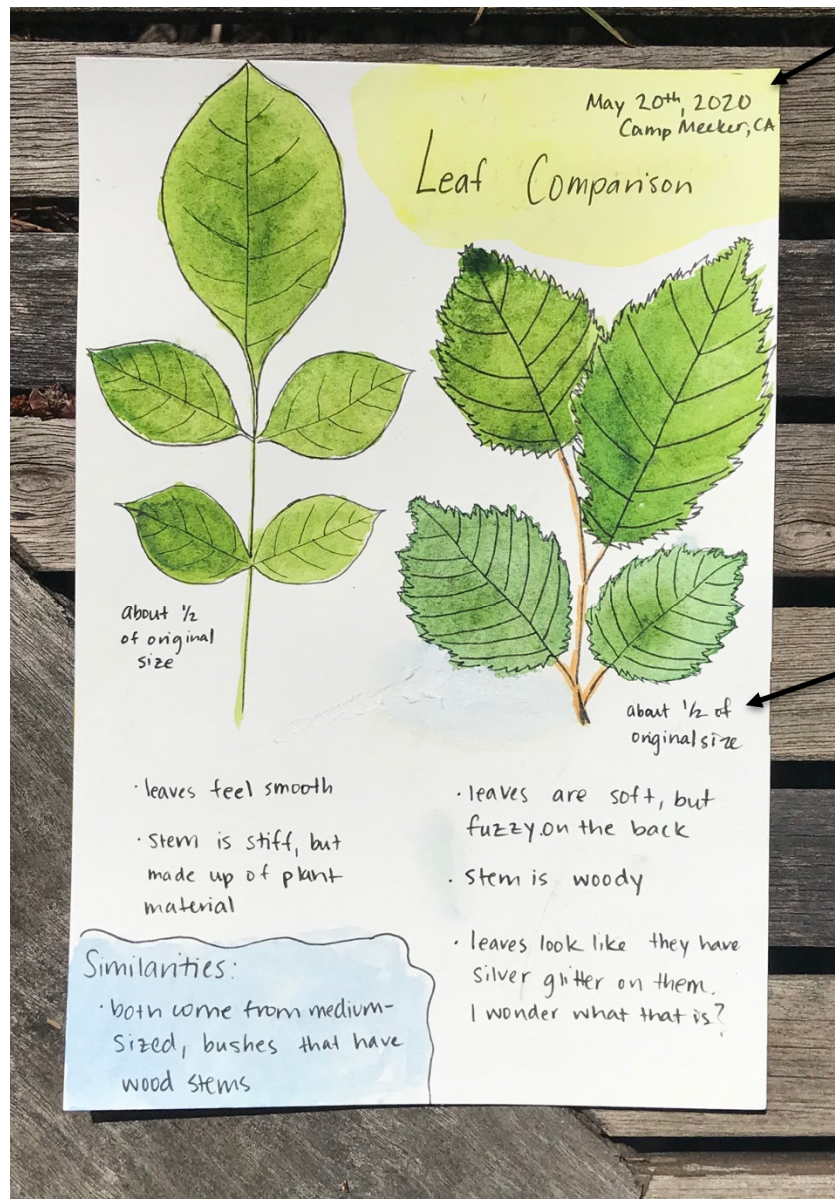


Nature Journaling: Make Comparisons
