

# Nature Journaling: String Safari

You can go on a miniature safari by observing a small patch of ground.

- Put a loop of string on the ground. (The string can be 5 to 10 feet long, or you could use a hula hoop.)
- Take a close look at what is within your loop of string. Use writing and drawing to record observations about subjects within your loop.
- Use numbers to record amounts of interesting objects.
- You might include a small map of where things are located within your string.
